The Washington Family Papers, 1796-1962, are centered around "Wessyngton," the Washington family home built in 1818 by Joseph Washington, tobacco planter, near Cedar Hill in Robertson County, Tennessee. The papers contain records of the plantation as well as the correspondence of four generations: Joseph Washington (1770-1848), tobacco planter; George Augustine Washington (1815-1892), tobacco planter, railroad executive, and capitalist; Joseph Edwin Washington (1851-1915), Congressman and tobacco farmer; and George Augustine Washington (1879-1964), attorney, tobacco farmer, and genealogist. The papers were gifts of Mrs. Mary Kinsolving, Baltimore, Md.; Hickman Price, Jr., Palm Beach, Fla.; and Mrs. Anne K. Talbott, Cookeville, Tenn.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

Joseph Washington

- 1770 Born July 8, in Southhampton County, Virginia; son of Joseph and Zilla (Branch) Washington
- 1796 Came to Tennessee and settled near Cedar Hill in Robertson County on Sulphur Fork; came with money and slaves and began to farm
- 1798 First purchase of land was 60 acres from Hugh Lewis for \$360
- 1812 March 12, married Mary Cheatham, daughter of Archer Cheatham, of Robertson County, Tennessee, and a distant Washington cousin
- ca. 1814 Began building "Wessyngton" on his land in Robertson County
- 1819 Completed his brick home "Wessyngton"
- 1848 Died November 28, and is buried in the family cemetery at "Wessyngton"

George Augustine Washington

- 1815 May 24, born at "Wessyngton," son of Joseph and Mary (Cheatham) Washington
- 1832 May 14, matriculated during the Summer Session of the University of Nashville
- 1842 September 15, married Margaret Adelaide Lewis (1823-1844) daughter of William Berkeley Lewis (1784-1866) of "Fairfield," Nashville, Tennessee
- 1844 November 3, William Lewis Washington was born
- 1844 November 22, Adelaide (Lewis) Washington died and is buried in the family cemetery at "Wessyinton"
- 1849 June 21, married Jane Smith (1830-1894), daughter of Joseph Lawrence Dawson Smith and Mary Jackson (Hanna) Smith, of Florence, Alabama
- 1850-60 Increased his father's estate enormously and became one of the South's largest and wealthiest tobacco planters
- 1865-80 Successfully speculated in gold, stocks and bonds in New York City and London
- 1871 Became President and Receiver of Edgefield and Kentucky Railroad
- 1872 Elected to Tennessee House of Representatives and served one term
- 1874 Elected director, Louisville and Nashville Railroad
- 1892 December 4, died and is buried in family cemetery at "Wessyngton"

Joseph Edwin Washington

- 1851 November 10, born at "Wessyngton," son of George and Jane (Smith) Washington; received early instruction at home
- 1873 June 26, graduated from Georgetown College, Washington, D.C.
- 1874 Studied law with the first class organized at Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tennessee; admitted to the bar but never practiced
- 1877-79 Member, Tennessee House of Representatives
- 1879 January 15, married Mary Bolling Kemp (1861-1946), daughter of Peter and Seigniora Peyton (Bolling) Kemp
- 1880 Presidential elector on the Democratic ticket of Hancock and English
- 1887-97 Representative in the United States Congress
- 1896 Not a candidate for re-election; returned to agricultural pursuits at "Wessyngton"
Appointed Road Commissioner, Robertson County, Tennessee; Member Board of Trust, Vanderbilt University, Nashville, Tennessee; Director, Nashville, Chattanooga and St. Louis Railroad and Nashville and Decatur Railroad
- 1915 August 28, died and is buried in family cemetery at "Wessyngton"

George Augustine Washington

1879	October 27, born at "Wessyngton"
1887-97	Lived in Washington, D.C., when his father was in Congress and attended the public schools
ca. 1900	Graduated from Yale University
ca. 1902	Graduated from Harvard Law School
ca. 1903-34	Practiced law in New York City
ca. 1934	Returned to "Wessyngton" to keep the estate together
1964	February 26, died at "Wessyngton," and is buried in the family cemetery at "Wessyngton"

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The Washington Family Papers, containing approximately 11,200 items, cover the period 1796-1962. The collection is composed of accounts, (farm and household), bills of sale, cards (business and calling), certificates, correspondence, court records, diaries, financial records, genealogical data, inventories, invitations, journals, land records, legal documents, military records, newspapers, notebooks, obituaries, passes, photographs, programs, promissory notes, publications, railroad papers, receipts, school records, speeches, tax lists and receipts, and several miscellaneous items.

About 6,000 items of the collection consist of family and business correspondence. The bulk of the family correspondence is made up of letters written between George and Jane (Smith) Washington while the former was away on frequent business trips to New Orleans, New York, and other cities; the letters of William Berkeley Lewis to his daughter Margaret Adelaide (Lewis) Washington and to his son-in-law, George A Washington; and the letters between Jane (Smith) Washington and her son Joseph Edwin while the latter was attending school at Georgetown University.

Besides the numerous incoming business letters to Joseph and George Washington from business firms in Nashville, New Orleans, Louisville, Cincinnati, New York, and elsewhere, particularly in the antebellum period, there is the vast correspondence of Congressman Joseph Edwin Washington of the 6th and, later 7th District of Tennessee.

The correspondence with U.S. Representative Washington during his years in Washington, D.C., 1887-1897, from his constituents in Middle Tennessee clearly indicates that voter concerns were in securing a position-usually with the postal service-in the federal government, gaining approval of a Civil War pension application or a war property claim, receiving a free packet of garden seed from the Department of Agriculture, or being placed on the mailing list for government publications. These were immediate and personal interests of Tennesseans in the last part of the nineteenth century whereas the tariff and silver issues stimulated only moderate voter response.

A notable characteristic of the outgoing business correspondence of George Washington was the making of handwritten copies of letters sent to various firms with whom the Washingtons did business. These letters combined with the replies received provide a substantially complete record of transactions with mercantile commission firms in New Orleans and banking and brokerage houses in New York and London.

Prominent correspondents include John Allison, D. C. Baldwin, Willie Blount, Archibald Butt, E. W. Carmack, Richard Cheatham, A. S. Colyar, John H. Curry, Charles W. Dabney, Jr., J. M. Dickinson, Francis B. Fogg, Joseph S. Fowler, Hilary Herbert, Andrew Jackson, Jr., Cave Johnson, John Overton Lea, William Berkeley Lewis, Alphonse Pageat, Mrs. James K. Polk, Charles T. Quintard, Michael Savage, Adlai E. Stevenson, Robert L. Taylor, and George N. Tillman.

Prominent persons mentioned in the correspondence include Henry Ward Beecher, Aaron Burr, Henry Clay, Joseph S. Fowler, Ulysses S. Grant, Felix Grundy, Andrew Jackson, Andrew Johnson, John H. McDowell, Randal William McGavock, Wendell Phillips, James K. Polk, Montfort Stokes, John Tyler and Martin Van Buren.

An examination of the Washington farm accounts reveals the extent of ham and tobacco shipments that were made to New Orleans by steamboat from Clarksville, Tennessee via the Cumberland, Ohio and Mississippi Rivers in the pre-Civil War period. The volume of this agricultural business is re-

flected in the bills of lading, sales receipts, and market reports from Fellowes and Company in New Orleans. This record is augmented by the voluminous correspondence from this commission firm through the letters of its agent, Thompson Greenfield. The uncertain economic conditions in the tobacco industry in the 1850's were reflected in the suspension of payments by Fellowes and Company in the middle of that decade after assurances to the contrary had been made to George Washington. These developments can be followed through the letters of Greenfield.

Not only was George Washington of Robertson County, Tennessee an extensive tobacco planter but was also one of the largest slaveholders in Tennessee and all the South. An inventory in 1860 reveals that there were 187 slaves on the "home place" alone. Further inventories for 1830, 1850 and 1856 are also available. The record of slave purchases may be found by checking the bills of sale. The slave accounts provide information on the purchase of food and clothing supplies, such as linsey-woolsey, osnaburg, brogans and hats. The medical bills for treatment of slave illnesses during 1815-1860 are also available under the same heading. Finally, slave accounts list bills for runaways and slaves hired out.

Financial records listed as banking, brokerage, and securities accounts disclose how George Washington during the Civil War and, particularly, afterward shifted his emphasis from the growing and marketing of tobacco to investments in bonds, stock, and gold. The transactions with such banking houses and brokerage firms as J. B. Alexander Company and Thos. Eakin during the 1870's and beyond plus the stock investments in such railroads as the Edgefield and Kentucky and the Louisville and Nashville are all indicative of this capitalistic trend.

Genealogical data for the Branch, Cheatham, Jackson, Hanna, Kemp, Lanier, Lang, and Washington families may be found by checking the container list. Additional genealogical data is included in some of the family correspondence.

Land records consist of agreements, deeds, grants, plats, and surveys, pre-emptions and other miscellaneous items. Of special interest are the land grants of Kentucky, North Carolina, and Tennessee which date as early as 1784. From the original holders of these grants or their successive owners Joseph Washington acquired the lands part of which eventually became known as "Wessyngton."

Legal documents include contracts--such as sharecropper arrangements after the Civil War, estate papers, the marriage record of William L. Washington, power of attorney, and wills.

Military records include the papers relating to the case of George Washington killing a bushwacker in 1864; impressments; lists of Negro enlistments in the Union army; an oath of allegiance taken by Washington; a command order by Gen. Buell; and a pass issued to George Washington dated September 29, 1863.

Other material included in the collection are cards of various types; college catalogs; newspaper clippings; diaries of George Washington; invitations, most notably from Presidents Cleveland and McKinley to the White House; journals; newspapers; notebooks of the Washington children; passes (especially to the impeachment trial of President Andrew Johnson); photographs of "Wessyngton" and the Washington family members; programs; railroad papers, including the Edgefield and Kentucky Railroad Company, 1871-1872; a recorded interview of John and Anne K. Talbott at "Wessyngton" on August 15, 1981, which supplies a number of stories about the Washington family; school records of the Washington family; speeches, including the one delivered by Joseph E. Washington at "Wessyngton" on the centennial observance of George Washington's birthday; and tax lists and receipts.

The historical value of this collection is wide. It offers detailed information on the tobacco industry in the middle South in the first half of nineteenth century. It provides an intimate view of the slavery system in the ante-bellum period. Genealogists interested in locating black ancestors may find earlier family members. An economic historian who is interested in tracing the shift of economic motivating forces in the middle South before the Civil War and afterwards could profit through the study of the experiences of one important tobacco planter and capitalist. It provides insights into the sufferings of one Southern family during the Civil War. It gives an overview into political motivating factors in the 1880s and 1890s. And the general collection has value for any writer who might be investigating manuscript material for a social history of one Southern planter family in the last century.
